## Bites of Bread from Bob

Our 2009 Advent Theme is based on Charles Dickens's, "A Christmas Carol". So what does a 19th century British novelist have to do with Christmas in the 21st century America? More than you may think. London in 1843 was a city of 3 million people. In fact, it was the largest city in Europe, and industrial megalopolis in which wealth and fashion sprang up amid sweatshop factories and rampant poverty. That was the year Dickens published "A Christmas Carol", perhaps the most recognizable Christmas story of all time. Even though this timeless tale pictures both the charming and uncharitable parts of London, it has helped to define what most Americans think of as the ideal Christmas. Horse-drawn carriages, dressy holiday balls, ornamented trees inside, fresh-fallen snow outside, wreathed merchant's doors, and festive family meals. Although "A Christmas Carol" is neither a song to be sung nor an overtly Christian work of literature, its haunting words are consistent with the truth found in "Joy to the World". This classic story eloquently portrays both the sinful state of selfish humanity and the wonder of conversion made possible by the birth of Christ. In Ebenezer Scrooge, we see a new birth of sorts. In Tiny Tim, we are reminded why Jesus esteemed childlike faith

as a prerequisite for entering the kingdom of God.

Charles Dickens was not necessarily a religious man, but it is obvious he had an understanding of biblical values. Redemption permeates his work. In a letter Dickens wrote to Rev. D. Macrae, we hear the heartbeat of a man familiar with Christmas truth:

*With a deep sense of my great responsibility always upon me when I exercise art, one of my most constant and most earnest endeavors has been to exhibit in all my good people some faint reflections of our great Master, and unostentatiously to lead the reader up to those teachings as the great source of all moral goodness. All my strongest illustrations are drawn from the New Testament; all my social abuses are shown as departures from its spirit; all my good people are humble, charitable, faithful and forgiving.*

This year let Christ, the Spirit within "A Christmas Carol", transform you, as well as Scrooge.

*"And it was always said of him that he knew how to keep Christmas well, if any man alive possessed the knowledge. May that be truly said of us, and all of us! And so, as Tiny Tim observed; God Bless us, every one!"*
